Graced with three platinum albums, Terri Clark is one of the most unique voices in country music and one of very few female country artists who is truly an accomplished guitar player. Raised in Alberta, Clark was the first Canadian female to be inducted into the prestigious Grand Ole' Opry, and has been honored with CMA and ACM Female Vocalist of the Year nominations, as well as a string of hits that includes "Easy On The Eyes," "When Boy Meets Girl," "I Wanna Do It All," "Poor Poor Pitiful Me" and "Girls Lie Too."

A prolific writer as well as performer, Clark's first deal in Nashville was as a songwriter.
